HOUSEHOLD CHEMICAL CLEAN-UP DAYS

Items Not Accepted*

PAINT— Oil & Latex – Dispose of with household trash in solid form. Air dry and use kitty litter or waste paint hardener. Exception: Rye Brook, White Plains and Yorktown residents must dispose of empty or hardened paint cans on bulk pick-up days.

Motor Oil – Take to service station or motor oil retail outlet.

Vehicle Batteries – Take to a local scrap metal dealer or any vehicle battery retail outlet.

Non-rechargeable Batteries – Dispose of in trash.

Compressed Gas Cylinders – e.g. helium and oxygen tanks, 20 pound BBQ tanks

Freon & Appliances with Freon – e.g. air conditioners, dehumidifiers

Smoke & Fire Detectors

Explosives – e.g. flares, fireworks, ammunition

Pharmaceutical or Medical Waste

Materials from Commercial & Institutional Users

Also remember -

Close all bags and bottles tightly.

All chemicals must be in original or labeled containers.

Place all chemicals in a sturdy box and in the trunk of your car.

Residential chemicals only. Materials from businesses, institutions and schools will not be accepted.

There is no fee, but pre-registration is required for 100 pounds or more of solid material or 25 gallons or more of liquid. To pre-register, call (914) 813-5425.

Directions:

FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT (FDR) STATE PARK, Yorktown Heights - Taconic State Parkway to exit for FDR State Park. Follow signs.

COUNTY RECYCLING CENTER, Yonkers (across from Stew Leonard's and Home Depot)

From the north: NYS Thruway (south) to first exit after toll booth, exit 6A/Stew Leonard Drive. Turn left at light. Follow signs.

From the south: NYS Thruway (north) to exit 6A/Stew Leonard Drive (last exit before toll). Proceed straight to stop light. Turn right at light. Follow signs.

PLAYLAND PARK, Rye

Take I-95 to Exit 19/Playland Parkway. Proceed to end of Parkway. Follow signs.

CROTON POINT PARK, Croton-on-Hudson

Croton Point Avenue - Thruway to Exit 9, (Tarrytown). Proceed North on Route 9 for approximately 10 miles and exit at Croton Point Avenue turn left at end of ramp; turn left at light; Park entrance straight ahead.

ANTHONY VETERAN PARK, Ardsley

11 Olympic Lane - Saw Mill River Parkway South to Dobbs Ferry/Ardsley, Exit #17. Turn left at Ashford Ave., left onto 9A north. Bear right onto Heatherdell Road 1 mile, turn left on Olympic Lane and follow road to Park.

IS COMING TO HOUSEHOLD CHEMICAL CLEAN-UP DAYS

Now you can safely destroy unwanted personal papers and documents!

Along with getting rid of unwanted household chemicals and other hazardous household wastes, now you can safely destroy unwanted personal papers and documents. The Shred Mobile will be available for Westchester residents at the 2007 Household Chemical Clean-Up Days listed to the right.

- The Shred Mobile is for *residents only*, to shred confidential papers.
- Paper generated by businesses, schools, institutions, government or municipal offices is not acceptable at these events. County staff will inspect all paper to be shredded and will reject any paper identified as commercial or institutional.
- Each resident may bring a maximum of 4 file boxes, approximately 10" by 12" by 15" in size.
- All paper must be freed of clips, bindings, folders and files.
- No bound or hardcover ledger books are allowed.

Shred your personal documents
Help fight identity theft

Why shred?

Westchester County wants to help protect residents from identity theft. That's why the Shred Mobile is available to help residents destroy unwanted personal papers and documents with personal identifying information.

Old documents and bills are a gold mine for identity thieves. One of the best ways to minimize the risk of identity theft is to shred all documents no longer in use that have personal identifying information such as name, address, phone number, credit card number or Social Security number. Such documents should be shredded before they are recycled.

What should you shred?

Pre-approved credit card applications, old credit card bills, receipts, bank statements, old tax returns or any other documents containing your name, address and other identifying information.

Items Not Accepted*

From the south: NYS Thruway (north) to exit 6A/Stew Leonard Drive (last exit before toll). Proceed straight to stop light. Turn right at light. Follow signs.

PLAYLAND PARK, Rye Take I-95 to Exit 19/Playland Parkway. Proceed to end of Parkway. Follow signs.

CROTON POINT PARK, Croton-on-Hudson Croton Point Avenue - Thruway to Exit 9, (Tarrytown). Proceed North on Route 9 for approximately 10 miles and exit at Croton Point Avenue turn left at end of ramp; turn left at light; Park entrance straight ahead.

ANTHONY VETERAN PARK, Ardsley 11 Olympic Lane - Saw Mill River Parkway South to Dobbs Ferry/Ardsley, Exit #17. Turn left at Ashford Ave., left onto 9A north. Bear right onto Heatherdell Road 1 mile, turn left on Olympic Lane and follow road to Park.
