



A Message from Westchester County Executive Robert P. Astorino

Proper disposal of medication is both an environmental and public safety concern. Westchester is dedicated to making medication take-back as easy for residents as possible, with several local options now available. My administration, along with the Department of Environmental Facilities, the Department of Health, and the Westchester County Coalition for Drug & Alcohol Free Youth, wants to ensure the safe disposal of medications.

Prescription drugs are now the second most abused category of drugs in the United States. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to abuse. Medications that are flushed down the toilet or poured down the drain can taint our local rivers and streams.

Westchester County's Med Take-Back Program provides residents with an opportunity to safely, conveniently, and confidentially dispose of unwanted medications.

How Do I Participate?

- Residents can bring medications to one of the participating police departments at any time, 24/7.
- Residents can bring medications, by appointment, on the first Tuesday of the month to the Household Material Recovery Facility (H-MRF) at 15 Woods Road, Valhalla, NY 10595. Appointments can be made online or by calling the Recycling Helpline at (914) 813-5425.

Other Disposal Options

If residents cannot stop by a participating police station or the H-MRF, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) urges residents to mix the contents with undesirable substances (such as coffee grounds, cat litter or dirt), disguise to prevent discovery, tape the containers closed, and toss into the garbage—**NOT DOWN THE DRAIN!**



Medical Sharps and Needles



In addition to medications, many people are unsure of how to properly dispose of used hypodermic needles, or "sharps." Currently no state laws prohibit the disposal of hypodermic needles and other household sharps in the trash. Most municipalities allow it providing the sharps are safely packaged. Preferably, household sharps should be dropped off at the nearest hospital or nursing home, as New York State requires them to accept sharps.


